



A Brief History of the Marque Bassmen

MSS1(1949), MSS500(1957) and RSS7(1953) by Stanislaus Skura

The first motorcycle built 1949 by Mr. Stanislaw Skura, who is a motorcycle had to be destroyed after the intervention of our People's Army. Motorcycle design their own Mr. Skura called MSS1.Motorcycle sidecar wheel MSS1 jet is a 20-inch wheel from the truck, V2 OHV engine, capacity about 4500ccm, near the front and rear of the German aircraft carburetor from a German tank, the other transmission or reducer for heavy terrain handle the first passenger, motorcycle owned 5 seats (3 on a motorcycle and 2 in the basket) and 3 standing on pedestals in the back.



Engines in both bikes are not living their own designs from several years Stanislaus Skura, as well, and all motorcycles. Of course not performed on all engine components, was based on some common elements then available such as cylinders (in MSS1 cylinders of an aircraft engine, the MSS500 cylinder from the generator), connecting rods, gears, magneto, glass lamp, carburettor, wheels, tires , bearings ... Handwritten exercise of these elements was pointless. Casting was performed in the forms of clay mixed with sand. A suitable clay wore buckets from a distance of approximately 10km. Die-cast frame with a rear fender MSS500 is one piece. In addition to image a motorcycle without an engine, tank, seat.

Mr. Stanislaw Skura also produced bicycles. Pictured bike RSS7 1953.

The bike is made of ALUMUNIUM front trapeze, back Snuffles the central damper 3 speed derailleur and a few superb technical solutions.

t the April general meeting, it was announced that the Vancouver Island Dirt Riders Association (VIDRA) had asked if they could use the club's Enduro Track to host a "Suffering Prologue" on April 27th to



determine the start position of the "Suffering Hard Enduro" to be held the next day at the Shawnigan property.

Permission was granted with some conditions. Fifty-five riders attended the Suffering prologue between 3 classes – Gold, silver and woman. The racing was action packed with riders not holding back trying to get a good starting position for the next day. VMC member **Quinn McCullough** took first in gold while VMC member **Chris Lichty** took first in silver. All the way from Alberta **Melissa Harten** took first in the women's class.

NAME THE RIDER

John Ranger, a Canadian and National trials champion, was inducted into the Canadian Motorcycle Hall of Fame in 2015. He started riding trials in 1969 and was classed as an expert in 1971. He holds five National #1 plates from 1972–1976 and three Canadian Championships. Yamaha would not sponsor him when the National was in the west and to the best of my knowledge he never competed in this side of the country. MYSTERY MOTOR

The 1957 CZ Walter Type 852 was a successful road racing machine and was one considered to be on a par with MV Agusta, Mondial, Benelli and Ducati. The bevel-drive, 125cc, single-cylinder, four-stroke engine had double overhead cams and magnesium castings. It was a dedicated racing machine and only 32 bikes were produced. It was a pure GP racing machine.

The 1957 CZ Walter Type 852 was raced by Czech hero Frantisek Bartos, who enjoyed his best season as a rider for the CZ factory racing team in 1957. Bartos and the CZ Walter were ninth overall in the 125 World Road Racing Championship.

The Walter marque was not actually a CZ, it was a Walter, which was started by Josef Walter in Prague. Walter was a bicycle manufacturer, but started building motorcycles in 1903 before switching to automobile production in 1912. It became a CZ when the communists nationalized the company.

Josef Walter was joined by his sons Jaroslav and Jan and, in 1938 ,Jaroslav designed a 250cc and 350cc engine, first as an overhead valve design and later he penned an overhead cam version, that was sold as a kit engine that could be fitted to different brands of frames.

After the Second World War, Walter continued production, but the factory was nationalized by the communist party to be part of Jawa/CZ. That explains why this 1957 racing machine is called a CZ Walter Type 852. Jaroslav Walter became chief engineer for sports and racing machines at CZ.

The very rare Walter, CZ Walter and Horak Walter racing machines, built from 1938 into the late 1950s can fetch \$30,000 and up at auctions—depending on condition.

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Former member **Ron Wilson** in fine form in the 1978 Rick Wells Trial. As written in <u>Cycle Canada</u> that year under the heading:- <u>Spriggs Leads</u>. **Martin Spriggs** continued to dominate the experts class during the eighth annual Rick Wells Memorial Trial staged Sunday by the Victoria Motorcycle club at its property in Metchosin. **Spriggs** riding a Yamaha topped the class with 37 points under the reverse scoring system for his fourth straight victory in the annual event and sixth win over eight years of competition. **Ron Wilson** aboard a Bultaco, placed second in the class with 50 points and **Gary Nordstrom** riding a Yamaha was third with 87.

Results in other classes:- Seniors—1/ Peter Wille (Montesa) 26, 2/ Jim Raper (Montesa) 44, 3/ Bill McFarlane (Yamaha) 45. Novice- 1/ Bill Thompson of Duncan (Yamaha) 44, 2/ Blake McFarlane (Yamaha) 49, 3/ Gary Gronow (Yamaha) 56.

JOE BROWN MAJOR TRIAL BY ROGER BOOTHROYD

A few sprinkles of rain in the morning and blustery winds with heavier rain in the afternoon were in store for the 47 riders who entered the annual VMC Joe Brown Major Trial on April 28th. Four of those riders joined us from off the island. They were: **Steve Thomas** from Whitehorse, **Katie McGeachy** from Vernon, **Alex Le** from Squamish and **Andrew De Boer** from Whistler. Originally called the Border Trial, it was renamed the Joe Brown Trial in 1999. In 2002 life member **Howie Sadler** (RIP) donated the perpetual trophy to replace the missing one. In 2012, the Joe Brown Trial was combined with the Major Trial. Prior to the start the riders meeting was held with **Steve Fracy, Dave Fair** and **Kevin Ash** explaining the

With only three riders in the Junior class, **Raquel Cottier** on Vertigo was the winner with 13 points. In second was **Cecelia Olson** on Gas Gas with 52 points. Following up in third was **Matthew Duggan**, also on Gas Gas with 80 points. Only two loops were counted.
