Certainly not a motorcycle in the picture above, but, who knows, maybe one of those workers rode a bike ! Although the Kirk Coal Co. went out of business many years ago, (who uses coal anymore?), the company was supportive of the VMC, as were many businesses, by donating a large silver trophy for the Kirk Reliability Trial beginning in 1930. This was an event that was highly competitive combining riding skill, time and observed check riding. Sadly the demise of the event started around the 1980's when the riding checks were eliminated due to the enduro riders complaining that they were disadvantaged in riding checks. Then there was the problem of getting a committee to organize it. In 1984 it didn't run for three years and subsequently two years after that. In the later years it was combined a few times with a hard enduro run by the Vancouver Island Dirt Riders Association. It never did recover to be a yearly reliability trial. Over the years, the style of bikes improved and most trials riders only save their bike for riding observed trials. They don't want to ride cross country and most trials bikes don't have odometers. Also, no one wants to organize it, or ride to time and ride

observed sections, only go fast. This outcome has been the same for all our reliability trials. Riding cross country was absolutely the best of times !! Other companies that donated trophies are:-Brock Whitney Jewellers—Novice Trial Trophy, Valvoline Oil Comp.—Valvoline Trial, Wellburn Market—Wellburn Reliability Trial, Brentwood Reliability Trial—Brentwood Hotel, Goldstream Pub—Novice MiniScot, King John Inn—Nuts in May Road Ride, FW Francis—VI Hillclimb Championship, Municipality of Saanich—Saanich Motocross (trophy missing), C.C. Wakefield & Company (Castrol) —Scrambles Championship.

For those of us that rode the VMC's reliability trials, it was a good way to make memories, whether they're good or bad. Mind games with the other riders, checking your watch and odometer, zeroing a check point, cleaning an observed section, it was repeatedly, "the best of times."



#### VINTAGE SPEAKING

#### A Brief History of the Marque Imperia

Manufactured in Germany 1924-1935

Franz Becker's Imperia factory at Cologne, Kölner Motorrad und Maschinenbau (K.M.B.), initially built 247cc and 347cc ohv Blackburne-engine machines and also versions with the 490cc single-cylinder ohv JAP, but most had Swiss MAG power units of 346cc, 496cc, 596cc, 746cc and 996cc. With the exception of the smallest, all were ioe or ohv V-twins.



Becker became insolvent in 1926 and the brothers Felix and Rolf Schröldter purchased Imperia and moved the factory to Bad Godesberg.



At this point they added Lastendreiräder (cargo tricycles) to the range, but only a small number were produced between 1927 and 1929. Early in the 1930s famed Dutch designer Arthur F. Dom joined the firm, and during this period models with MAG 497cc IOE, 678cc V-twin ohv JAP and Sturmey-Archer 346cc engines were developed, but mainly 248cc, 348cc and 498cc fourvalve Rudge-built Python proprietary ohv four-valve singles. The Imperia Python machines were widely used in competition. 1933 saw the introduction of Villiers-engine models of 150 & 200cc.

That same year, import of foreign engines into Germany became increasingly difficult due to high taxes imposed by the Nazi government, and Dom, being a foreign national, left. Locally

sourced Bark two- and four-stroke engines were employed in several models, and Rolf Schräldter designed a range of new and very unconventional two-strokes. The first was a 348cc double-piston single with the pistons running in opposite directions and a single sparkplug in the centre, based on a Junkers patent. There were really two crankshafts, one on each side of the cylinder. They were connected by a chain and on top was a supercharger. This air-cooled engine was developing well in 1935 when an international ban on alcohol fuels in racing took force, and major cooling problems were encountered when running benzine fuel. Imperia again ran into financial difficulties, due in the main to the production of too many unconventional designs. These included a 498cc horizontally-opposed two-stroke twin with Trilok gearbox and shaft drive, and the company was also building 746cc sports and racing cars. As a result, production was halted towards the end of 1935. Imperia Schwenker Sidecar 1935

Heinz Koster was an engineer for the Imperia Motor Cycle and Side-car works in Koln who, in 1935, patented the Schwenker design for leaning sidecars

# 2024 Rocky Mountain Motogiro - By gary nordstrom

Once again, in early September, **Martin Spriggs, Ron Foster** and I set off for a bit of an adventure in Nakusp. Just getting there is fun. From Vernon, head east over the Monashee Mountains with curves made for motorcycles. Then cross the Arrow Lakes on the Needles cable ferry and go north to the town of Nakusp, a beautiful hidden gem well north of Nelson.

Day 1 of this Canadian Vintage Motorcycle Group sanctioned event is a 300 km tour through Slocan to Nelson for lunch, returning via Ainsworth Hot Springs, Kaslo and then another great crooked road to New Denver and finally back to Nakusp. This loop is no mean feat for bikes that are built before 1970 and have displacements of 250 cc's or less. Including outriders, approximately 50 riders hailing from Calgary to Victoria rode in 30 degree weather.



L to R Ron Foster, Gary Nordstrom, Martin Spriggs Troubles, - we had a few. **Martin's** normally reliable 1937 **BSA** lost spark near Nelson and ended up in a chase truck for the rest of the day. **Ron's** Aermacchi quit 10 kms from the end. **Ron** grabbed onto the back box on my Yamaha DT1 and we wobbled our way to Nakusp at 60 kph! A police car passed us and either didn't notice, or didn't care! That evening these two very competent mechanics poured over their problems and were ready for day 2.

Trouble visited my 56 year old bike while gassing up the next morning. After paying at the till, I turned to find my DT1 lying on the pavement, side stand snapped off, handlebars and mirror askew and gas leaking out. Repairs were needed before the day's high speed challenge began.

Day 2 is when the real fun begins. Everyone gets a sighting run up the paved 10 km road to Nakusp Hot Springs

•\_\_\_\_\_\_ to become familiar with the bumps and curves. The road is closed to traffic for 20 minutes at a time to allow for 5 or 6 riders to race against time in two categories: fastest time or most consistent time over 2 or more runs. Italian bikes predominate in the speed class with British, Japanese and European bikes mixed in. Riders are sent off at 10 second intervals to limit passing, but passing does occur if the starter guesses incorrectly about who will be fastest in the group. Eighteen riders participated in this timed event.


In the first heat I started off strong but soon the Yam wouldn't take full throttle, then half, then a walking pace, and then a DNF. Meanwhile, **Martin** and **Ron** put in good runs. Turned out that my fuel filter was plugging up so it was an easy fix. With a new filter I was able to set some great intervals.

Ex VMC member Swiss Neiderberger flew up the course on his Motobi 250. Fellow Victorian Richard Levert set the fastest time at 6min 1sec on his race spec Honda Hawk. Ron and Martin both beat their times from previous years. Martin again won best bike and this year, the hard luck award for his day 1 troubles. I won the most consistent time trophy for the second year in a row. (One second slower on the second lap). Not a bad haul for the Island boys! Gary Nordstrom
